Guiding Questions

Our vision guides all of our decisions, through essential questions that are posed in our decision-making processes. We find ourselves constantly asking ourselves if we are moving the needle closer to becoming a Kentucky “District of Distinction.” Our guiding questions are adapted from Richard DuFour’s four guiding questions, which are: 1) What do we expect students to learn? 2) How will we know if they are learning? 3) What will we do when students are already proficient? 4) How do we respond when students do not learn?

Using those DuFour’s questions, we consistently utilize the following questions: 1) Where are we currently? 2) Where do we want to go? 3) How will we get there? 4) How will we communicate to all stakeholders? 5) How will we know when we arrive? It will be important that, as we reach our goal, we commit to reevaluating our status and begin the process again so that we continuously improve and do not become victim to complacency.
