

What is Title 1?

Title 1 is a federally funded program designed to reinforce the basic and advanced skills of students achieving below grade level.

Fleming County Schools currently participate in Title 1 (formerly known as Chapter 1). All elementary schools and Fleming Co. High School are considered School Wide Programs. They are served on the basis of the number of families within its boundaries who are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.

Non-public students living within a Title 1 school's boundaries are also eligible for services. Students are selected to participate based on academic need.

The Ten Required Components of a Title 1 Program.

1. Comprehensive needs assessment of the entire school.
2. School-wide reform using scientifically-based researched methods and strategies.
3. Instruction by highly qualified teachers.
4. High quality, ongoing professional development to enable all children to meet the Learning Standards.
5. Strategies to attract high quality, qualified teachers.
6. Strategies to increase parent involvement.
7. Plans for assisting preschool children in the transition from early childhood programs to elementary school programs.
8. Measures to include teachers in decisions regarding use of academic assessments.
9. Effective, timely, additional assistance to students who experience difficulty mastering state standards.
10. Coordination and integration of federal, state and local services.
