Fleming County High School SBDM Policy 8.1 Extracurricular Programs

CRITERIA FOR PROGRAMS

For an extracurricular program to be continued or to institute a new program, the program must:

1. Contribute to the following Kentucky Learning Goals:
 - Becoming a self-sufficient individual.
 - Becoming responsible members of a family, work group, or community, including demonstrating effectiveness in community service.
2. Generate and maintain student interest as well as attract students currently not involved in extracurricular or service projects.
3. Encourage, enhance, and maintain equity including but not limited to a wide range of opportunities for both male and female students.
4. Have a suitable adult sponsor and have appropriate adult supervision at all times.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION

Students will be determined eligible to participate in extracurricular activities by the Athletic Director on a weekly basis if they:

1. Maintain passing grades in at least six of seven classes.
 - a. Of their 7 classes to remain eligible for practice and games. Ineligibility means the student can NOT play or practice from Sunday – Sunday.
 - b. The student-athlete that does not meet this standard cannot regain eligibility until the next grade check.
 - c. Extra credit assignments, late work, or redoing work for a higher grade cannot occur to exempt the student from this policy after the weekly eligibility check.
2. All students must be in each class on the day (or on Friday for weekend activities) of a scheduled game or practice or they will not be allowed to participate that day. Exceptions to this policy includes doctor's statements, school sponsored activities, and activities pre-approved by the principal and athletic director. Students are to be present at school on the next school day following a game or practice/activity. To maintain eligibility, any absence or tardy must be excused. Students with an unexcused absence on the next school day after an extra-curricular activity will not be allowed to participate in the next event of that extra-curricular group.
3. To maintain eligibility, all students participating cannot be deemed as truant as defined by Fleming County Board Policy.

4. Where applicable, meet any requirements set by the appropriate sponsoring or governing organization.

COACHES AND SPONSORS

Each extracurricular activity will be led by an adult coach or sponsor who meets any applicable requirements set in law, or by sponsoring or governing organizations. The coach or sponsor will be responsible for personally supervising or ensuring that all students are supervised by an adult while they are participating in an activity, including practice time and travel time where applicable. Coaches and sponsors are responsible for maintaining current certifications and training (including medical) that are required.

The principal will assign coaches and sponsors from our school's current staff following our policy on Instructional and Non-Instructional Staff Time Assignment. If it is necessary to consider applicants who do not currently work at our school, our policy on Consultation will be followed.

Fleming County High School SBDM Policy 8.2 Co-curricular Competitions

CRITERIA FOR PROGRAMS

For a co-curricular competitions to be continued or to institute a new program, the program must:

1. Contribute to the following Kentucky Learning Goals:
 - Becoming a self-sufficient individual.
 - Becoming responsible members of a family, work group, or community, including demonstrating effectiveness in community service.
2. Generate and maintain student interest as well as attract students currently not involved in extracurricular or service projects.
3. Encourage, enhance, and maintain equity including but not limited to a wide range of opportunities for both male and female students.
4. Have a suitable adult sponsor and have appropriate adult supervision at all times.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION

Students will be determined eligible to participate in co-curricular competitions by the organization sponsor and roster submitted to the principal one week prior to the competition date(s) if they:

1. Maintain passing grades in at least six of seven classes.
 - a. Of their seven classes to remain eligible to compete the students must be passing at least six.
 - b. Extra credit assignments, late work, or redoing work for a higher grade cannot occur to exempt the student from this policy after the eligibility check and roster has been submitted to the principal.
2. All students must be in each class on the day (or on Friday for weekend activities) of a scheduled competition or they will not be allowed to participate that day. Exceptions to this policy includes doctor's statements, school sponsored activities, and activities pre-approved by the principal and sponsor. Students are to be present at school on the next school day following a competition.
3. To maintain eligibility, all students participating cannot be deemed as truant as defined by Fleming County Board Policy.
4. Where applicable, meet any requirements set by the appropriate sponsoring or governing organization.
